

## Why Is The Gel In The Probe Turning Brown?

Over time, the high temperatures of sterilization will discolor the gel in a FermProbe. This is often referred to as caramelization. It is normal, and in no way affects the performance of the electrode. This color change can also be used to approximate the age of the electrode.
